The results of this comprehensive self-assessment are published on a secure, private online portal showing how your programme performs as compared to best practice. The **portal includes a dashboard, key statistics, graphs and charts and the ability to 'drill-down' into details** and filter by key demographics. Reports and graphs can be extracted for inclusion in company reports.

Results are accompanied by analysis and advice from our expert team. Participants also benefit from quarterly deep-dive workshops to explore common themes arising from the Benchmark and discuss practical approaches to emerging risks.

STAGES OF THE ANNUAL BENCHMARKING PROCESS

Stage 1 Spring

Participants provide details about their anti-corruption programme via an online questionnaire.

Stage 2 Summer

Independent verification on a subset of questions is coordinated by Transparency International and carried out by our lead Benchmark partner PwC and strategic partner Grant Thornton.

Stage 3 Autumn

Participants' results are published on a secure, private online portal showing how their programme performs as compared to best practice, and they are subsequently ranked according to the other participants.

DEEP DIVE WORKSHOPS

Participants are encouraged to attend quarterly deep dive workshops, which explore key risk areas identified through the benchmarking exercise each year. These workshops provide an opportunity to:

- · Learn from Transparency International and other participants about best practice
- · Share and discuss anti-corruption approaches with peers and industry leaders
- · Address specific gaps in anti-corruption programmes and associated activities
- Inform understanding of emerging issues and anti-corruption trends
